A meeting of the Senate Committee on Outdoor Recreation and Tourism was held on Thursday, January 19, 2012 at 12:30 p.m. in Room 210 of the Farnum Building.

The meeting was called to order at 12:37 p.m.

Senator Hansen called the meeting to order.

Senator Hansen announced the order of business for the day:

Approval of Minutes

HB 5136 Rep. Schmidt Recreation; other; recreational vehicles; allow electronic verification of identity of applicant for title and registration purposes.

Senator Casperson moved to adopt the minutes from November 10, 2011 with unanimous consent. Without objection, the minutes were adopted.

Senator Hansen placed before the committee House Bill 5136 (Rep. W. Schmidt).

The following people testified on House Bill 5136 and answered questions from committee members:
