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MINUTES

The Senate Committee on Transportation held a meeting on Tuesday, September 11, 2012 at 12:30 p.m. in Room 100 of the Farnum Building.

Senator Casperson called the meeting to order at 12:33 p.m.

Attendance was recorded as follows:

Present: Senators Casperson (C), Kowall, Brandenburg, Pavlov, Hansen, Gleason, and Hood

Absent: None

Excused: None

Senator Casperson announced the following order of business:

- Adoption of June 12, 2012 minutes
- SB 1180 Sen. Hansen Vehicles; registration plates; use of "Pure Michigan" brand on standard design registration plates; allow.
- HB 5668 Rep. Jacobsen Vehicles; title; requirement for possession by dealer acquiring vehicle for resale; modify, and make general revisions to title transfer provision.
- SB 1091 Sen. Kowall Mobile homes; title; duplicate title for mobile home; require certification and information to verify the identity of individual submitting electronic request.

Senator Casperson led the members in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Senator Kowall made a motion to approve the minutes from the June 12, 2012 meeting; being no objection, the motion carried.

Senator Casperson announced the next order of business would be House Bill 5668. Representative Jacobsen gave members an overview of the bill.
