## COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES September 19, 2012

A meeting of the Senate Committee on Finance was scheduled for Wednesday, September 19, 2012, at 12:30 p.m., in room 100 of the Farnum Building.

#### The agenda summary is as follows:

HB 5444 Rep. Gilbert Sales tax; exemptions; definition of rolling stock used by an interstate fleet motor carrier; clarify.

HB 5445 Rep. Gilbert Use tax; exemptions; definition of rolling stock used by an interstate fleet motor carrier; clarify.

HB 4804 Rep. Schmidt Sales tax; collections; prepayment collection process; revise.

SB 264 Sen. Hildenbrand Use tax; collections; prepayment collection process; revise.

SB 1006 Sen. Jansen Michigan business tax; gross receipts; treatment of certain payments to subcontractors as purchases from other firms; clarify.
