**Senate Committee on Outdoor Recreation and Tourism**

A meeting of the Senate Committee on Outdoor Recreation and Tourism was held on Thursday, May 24, 2012 at 12:30 p.m. in Room 210 of the Farnum Building.

The meeting was called to order at 12:33 p.m.

Members present: Senators Hildenbrand, Meekhof, Casperson, Moolenaar, Gleason and Young  
Members excused: Senator Hansen

Senator Hildenbrand called the meeting to order.

Senator Hildenbrand announced the order of business for the day:

- Approval of Minutes
- SB 984 (Sen. Casperson) Weapons; firearms; procedures for out-of-state purchase of rifles and shotguns; clarify.
- SB 1045 (Sen. Gleason) Natural resources; hunting; disabled individual hunting on a licensed game bird hunting preserve; allow to possess a firearm in a motorized vehicle.
- HB 5053 (Rep. Shirkey) Natural resources; fishing; export of live minnows, wigglers, or crayfish as bait; allow.
- HB 5164 (Rep. Pettalia) Watercraft; other; inspection frequency, boat livery permit term, and certificate of number fee and term; revise for certain nonmotorized livery boats.

Senator Hildenbrand placed before the committee Senate Bill 984 (Sen. Casperson).

Senator Casperson moved that Senate Bill 984 be reported out of committee with the recommendation that the bill then pass. The motion prevailed by an affirmative vote of a majority of the members appointed to and serving on the committee, voting as follows:

Senator Hildenbrand moved to recommend immediate effect for Senate Bill 984. By unanimous consent, the committee further recommended that the bill be given immediate effect.

Senator Hildenbrand placed before the committee Senate Bill 1045 (Sen. Gleason). Senator Hildenbrand announced that there was a substitute for consideration. Senator Gleason and his staff, John LaMacchia, explained the bill and substitute to committee members and answered questions.
