MINUTES

The Senate Committee on Education held a meeting on Tuesday, November 5, 2013 at 2:00 p.m. in Room 210 of the Farnum Building.

Senator Pavlov called the meeting to order at 2:27 p.m.

Senator Pavlov announced the order of business for the Education Committee:

- Adoption of the minutes from the October 30, 2013 meeting
- HB 4352 Rep. Lyons Health; other; auto-injectable epinephrine device; allow prescribers to prescribe and pharmacists to dispense to school boards under certain circumstances and limit liability.
- HB 4353 Rep. Lyons Education; school districts; auto-injectable epinephrine device to be present at all public schools; require.
- HB 4713 Rep. Graves Education; safety; reporting requirement for public school safety drills; provide for.

Senator Colbeck made a motion to adopt the minutes from the October 30, 2013 meeting; being no objection, the motion prevailed.

Senator Pavlov announced the next order of business would be House Bills 4352-53. He reminded members testimony had been taken at the previous meeting.
