Senate Committee on Outdoor Recreation and Tourism
Minutes

A meeting of the Senate Committee on Outdoor Recreation and Tourism was held on Thursday, November 7, 2013 at 12:30 p.m. in Room 110 of the Farnum Building.

The meeting was called to order at 12:35 p.m.

Senator Hansen called the meeting to order.

Senator Hansen announced the order of business for the day:

- Approval of the Minutes
- HB 5103 (Rep. Rendon) – Recreation; trails; terms of snowmobile advisory council members; stagger.

Senator Hildenbrand moved to adopt the committee minutes from November 7, 2013 by unanimous consent. Without any objection, the minutes were adopted.

Senator Hansen placed before the committee House Bill 5103.

Senator Hansen invited Janelle Theisen, of Representative Rendon's office, forward to explain the bill and answer questions for committee members.
