HB 4742 (Kosowski) Family law; other; uniform interstate family support act (UIFSA); repeal and recreate. Creates new act & repeals 1996 PA 310 (MCL 552.1101 - 552.1901).

**Explanation of the position, including any recommended amendments:**

This is part of a 4 bill package (HB 4742-4745) that would enact the updated version of the Uniform Interstate Family Support Act (UIFSA). States are required to enact UIFSA in 2015 or they will lose federal funding of their child support program. The updated UIFSA extends to foreign countries as well as other states, and allows parties to consent to continuing jurisdiction in a state even if both parties have moved out of this state. This is a good solution for cases where the support order is being regularly paid by income withholding. The Family Law Section supports this bill.
