



House Bills 4162 and 4163

Presented May 6, 2015 to the Senate Regulatory Reform Committee by Barry Cargill, Executive Director of the Michigan Association for Home Care.

Michigan Home Care is pleased to support House Bill 4162 and 4163. When passed, this legislation will reduce the regulations involved with the installation of home stair-lifts, helping seniors and persons with disabilities remain in their homes longer, improve the person's quality of life, and reduce dependency on government insurance programs.

Current Michigan law regulates residential stair lifts the same as commercial elevators. We believe it is time for Michigan's elevator regulations to advance with the technical breakthroughs that are bringing new affordable products and services to the home consumer market. While the price and quality of available products has advanced to meet the demands of the home consumer, over-regulation often makes home stair-lifts cost prohibitive to many seniors and disabled persons.

Under the bills, individuals who are licensed elevator contractors or have a certification from the manufacturer of stair lifts may install residential stair lifts. The legislation maintains local control over the permitting process for stair lifts. We believe HB 4162 and 4163 will reduce the cost of installing stair lifts while maintaining safety and bringing Michigan regulations in line with neighboring states.

The Michigan Association for Home Care applauds the leadership of Representative Pscholka and Nesbitt in advancing legislation to help seniors and disabled persons stay in their home longer. We urge support for HB 4162 and 4163.
