COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES
September 7, 2016

A meeting of the Senate Committee on Regulatory Reform was scheduled for Wednesday, September 7, 2016, at 1:30 p.m., in the Senate Hearing Room on the Ground Floor of Boji Tower.

The agenda summary is as follows:

- 1) Reported SB 1025 (Sen. Booher) with recommendation and immediate effect.
- 2) Reported SB 1015 (S-2) (Sen. Warren) with recommendation and immediate effect.
- 3) Reported SB 1016 (Sen. O'Brien) with recommendation and immediate effect.

The Vice Chairman called the meeting to order at 1:31 p.m. He instructed the Clerk to call the roll. At that time, the following members were present: Vice Chairman Jones, Sen.(s) Knollenberg, Kowall, MacGregor, Hune, Warren, and Hertel, a quorum was present.

Due to Chairman Rocca's absence, Vice Chairman Jones chaired the meeting.

The Vice Chairman made a motion to adopt the meeting minutes from June 8, 2016. Without objection, the minutes were adopted.
