- “Excellent Education” is defined by 90/90/90/90 criteria.

# Public Education Matters



# Failing Our State and Citizens

91 out of 100 DPS students were not proficient.




85 out of 100 Detroit charter students were not proficient.

# Built Locally & Promising

## Detroit Achievement Academy, 2013

- 2014-2015 school year - NWEA MAP growth in the 99th percentile nationally
- 100% parent satisfaction for all three years
- 2015 MI PSA Teacher of the Year



## Boggs School, 2013

- Ranked “very strong” for supportive environment in a citywide survey of students & teachers
- 20% increase in kids making their target gains in reading, and 15% in math
- Place-Based Education



# Celebrate & Replicate Proven Models



## Glazer Elementary, started turnaround in 2011

- Homework completion increased from 30% to 70% school-wide
- Started in bottom 5%, Glazer registered the 3rd best Math M-Step scores among all charters
- Ranked “very strong” for ambitious instruction in a citywide survey of students & teachers

## Davison, founded a long-time ago

- Consistently top 10 performer across state data, including a top math score on M-Step
- MicroSociety School- all students participate in student-run & operated businesses
- A top performer across all categories in a citywide survey of students & teachers
