Caring for the communities we serve

- Paid **\$512 million** in state and local taxes.
- Gave **\$18.5 million** to Michigan nonprofits. That includes donations from the Consumers Energy Foundation, Consumers Energy, and its employees and retirees.
- Spent about **\$1 billion** with Michigan businesses through the state's Pure Michigan Business Connect program.
- Helped Michigan customers save **\$539 million** through our energy efficiency programs. Since 2009, those savings total more than **\$2 billion**.
- Spent **\$2 billion** on infrastructure replacement, additions and upgrades statewide – and **\$1 billion** on operations and maintenance expenses.
