The original YMCA facility, opened in 1976, is in need of mechanical and operational upgrades and improvements to continue meeting the needs of our community. This funding will help with essential infrastructure improvements and upgrades. This funding will also help expand access to and enhance early childhood programs and learning services. The Tri-Cities Family YMCA serves over 10,000 individuals and families annually. The Tri-Cities Family YMCA has provided health and wellness programs and services for residents of all ages in northwest Ottawa County since 1963. Children's programs include quality affordable childcare and preschool, youth sports and recreation, social events, life-saving swim lessons, and summer day camps which provide a vital childcare resource for working families when school is out. Programs for adults include fitness and wellness classes for seniors, programs to

prevent and manage chronic disease, plus an array of sports leagues, fitness classes and amenities for teens through adults. They YMCA strengthens the community through free meal distribution for vulnerable children, free memberships for 7th graders, and a Great Start Readiness Program for families in need of subsidized preschool.
